THE NEED

GSHPA's Financial Assistance Program ensures that no girl is turned away from life-changing Girl Scout programming because of her family's financial circumstances.

The average annual household income of girls who have applied for and received financial assistance is \$23,532.

PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

We never want fees to be a barrier for a girl to have the Girl Scout leadership experience. Based on the availability of funds, girls who qualify for free or reduced school lunches also qualify for financial assistance at GSHPA. Each year more than \$235,000 is provided to help with the cost of everything from annual membership fees to covering the cost of uniforms.

Your support gives girls who lack the financial resources, the chance to participate in Girl Scouts.
