

# Health Care

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Upon arrival to camp, campers will receive a health screening from camp staff to look for any sickness that is communicable, such as head lice or the flu. Any concerns will be discussed with parents/guardians. If you think your camper has head lice or you are in the process of treating head lice, please do not come to camp. If head lice are detected, the camper will be sent home, and they cannot return until 24 hours after treatment. Upon arrival, she will be screened again to ensure the lice has been eliminated.

All medication (over-the-counter AND prescription) must be turned in to the Healthcare Supervisor during check-in, and it must be in the original container labeled with the camper's name, medicine, prescribed dosage, and time to be administered. All medication will be given in the prescribed dosage, in the presence of an adult, as per written instructions of a custodial parent, a guardian, or a physician. The camper may need to carry and administer some medications directly, such as bronchial inhalers. Herbal remedies are not viewed as prescribed dosages unless a doctor's note has accompanied the herbal remedies.

While we take every precaution possible at camp, illnesses and/or injuries can occur. All staff members are trained, at a minimum, in basic first aid/CPR, but many staff have higher level certifications. Our Healthcare Supervisor is a certified Registered Nurse (or higher) and is responsible for the well-being of everyone at camp. All visits to the nurse are documented in your child's CampDoc profile, but you will only be notified of incidents beyond basic cuts and scrapes.

Should your camper sustain an injury or contract an illness requiring further treatment, a parent/guardian will be notified immediately by the Health Supervisor or Camp Director.
