# girl scouts gold award

---

The Girl Scout Gold Award is the highest and most prestigious award a girl can achieve in Girl Scouting. Since 1916, the award has stood for excellence and leadership for girls everywhere. We would like to congratulate today's honorees who join the ranks of generations of young women who have made a difference in their communities and beyond over the years.

## History of the Girl Scout Gold Award

The Golden Eagle of Merit, the highest award in Girl Scouting from 1916 to 1919, marked the beginning of a long tradition of using prestigious awards to recognize girls who make a difference in their communities and in their own lives.

From 1940 to 1963, the Curved Bar Award was the highest honor in Girl Scouting.

From 1963 to 1980, First Class was the highest award. To achieve First Class meant a girl was an "all-around" person with some skills in many fields and a proficiency in one.

In 1980, the Girl Scout Gold Award became the highest award a Girl Scout could earn. Someone once described the Girl Scout Gold Award as being "what you really want to be remembered for" in Girl Scouting.

For many, the leadership skills, organizational skills and sense of community and commitment that come from "going for the Gold" set the foundation for a lifetime of active citizenship.

## The Gold Award Project

The Gold Award project is the culmination of all the work a girl puts into "going for the Gold." It is something a girl can be passionate about—in thought, deed and action. The project is something that fulfills a need within a girl's community (whether local or global), creates change and, hopefully, is something that becomes ongoing. The project is more than a good service project—it encompasses organizational, leadership and networking skills.

## Did you know?

A Girl Scout who has earned her Gold Award immediately rises one rank in any of the U.S. military branches.

# Mistress of Ceremonies

Kate Crowley serves as Board Chair for the Girl Scouts in the Heart of Pennsylvania Council. She has been employed by the Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection for the last 25 years and is currently the Water Program Manager in the Department's Northeast Regional Office in Wilkes-Barre. Kate was the first woman to occupy this position statewide and now is the senior Water Manager in the Commonwealth. She is a 1999 graduate of the Leadership Development Institute for Women in State Government. Kate has a B.S. in Civil and Environmental Engineering from Clarkson University in Potsdam, New York.



A former Girl Scout from southern tier New York State, Kate has held a number of positions in Girl Scouting including serving as Board Secretary for GSHPA. She recently chaired the Long Range Property Planning Task Group which completed a master plan for the council's camp properties.

Kate was also an officer of the former Scranton Pocono Council, chair of two Women of Distinction events, member of the Property Committee and subcommittee chair for the Council Performance Assessment. Previously honored as a Woman of Distinction, she also was involved with the merger, serving on the Council Realignment Committee and co-chairing the Service Delivery Subcommittee.

Kate is an active volunteer in the community, coordinating the American Cancer Society Daffodil Days sales at her workplace for more than ten years and having served on the advisory board of the Keystone College Water Discovery Center. She is a trained American Red Cross disaster services responder and frequently assists with fundraisers for her county's Red Cross chapter.

Kate has a passion for Girl Scouting, an organization she credits with her current professional success.



## Keynote Speaker

Kathleen A. McGinty is new to the GSHPA Board of Directors. She is Senior Vice President and Managing Director of Strategic Growth at Weston Solutions, Inc., a company focused on sustainable property remediation and redevelopment in the U.S. and abroad. Ms. McGinty is also an Operating Partner at Element LLC, a private equity firm investing in early and mid-stage clean technology companies. She is a Director at NRG Energy, Inc., a leading wholesale power company and Iberdrola USA, Inc., a gas and electric utility.

In July 2008, Ms. McGinty stepped down as Secretary of the Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection and as Chair of the Pennsylvania Energy Development Authority. During her tenure, she helped lead the state's successful effort to attract market-leading clean technology and renewable energy companies to headquarter and manufacture in Pennsylvania, bringing more than \$1 billion in new investment and creating some 3,000 new jobs.

Previous to her service in Pennsylvania, Ms. McGinty was President Bill Clinton's Chair of the White House Council on Environmental Quality and Legislative Assistant and Environmental Advisor to then-Senator Al Gore. She was also a Senior Visiting Fellow for a year in New Delhi, India at TERI, the Tata Energy Research Institute. Ms. McGinty holds a Bachelor of Science degree in Chemistry from Saint Joseph's University and a Juris Doctor from Columbia University School of Law, as well as three honorary doctorates in Public Service and Humane Letters. Ms. McGinty was designated a "Global Leader for Tomorrow" by the World Economic Forum in Davos, Switzerland, and Woman of the Year by the Women's Council on Energy and the Environment. She is the recipient of numerous awards for environmental leadership including the Ansel Adams Award of The Wilderness Society, the "All the Right Stuff" award of the Apollo Alliance and the "Unsung Hero" award of the League of Conservation Voters. She and her husband, Dr. Karl Hausker, have three daughters and live in Camp Hill, Pennsylvania.
